CAS At a Glance: EXPERIENCES

When you meet with your advisees, it is important to know what kinds of experiences will be approved and which will not.

The following experiences would be approved for CAS, if they include a supervisor and documentation:

- Any and all extra-curricular clubs, sports, or activities
- Any outside sporting, training, musical, or artistic activities
- Any and all volunteering experiences that can be verified
- Any artistic or creative project outside of school that results in a product

Some experiences may or may not be CAS experiences:

- Participation in the Hill-Freedman album, <u>only</u> if your work is featured on the final album and your participation can be verified by Mr. Thurman
- Physical activity (like regular walks or runs) <u>only</u> if you do it multiple times and you document it with a fitness tracker
- Participation in Hill-Freedman music lessons <u>only</u> if you attend lessons regularly, attend the concert, and your instructor signs off saying that you clearly worked and practiced <u>outside of class</u> to develop your skills

The following experiences would NOT be approved for CAS:

- Activities that happened before your junior year
- Activities that only benefit one teacher, like "cleaning up a room" or "sweeping a floor"
- Classes, projects, or activities that are <u>already</u> a part of the IB Diploma program.
- Simple, tedious, repetitive work that does not allow growth.
- Passive pursuits such as attending a concert, museum visit, theater, or exhibition.
- Family or religious duties or any specifically religious activities.
- Work experience that only benefits the student, or involves financial gain.
- An activity where there is no responsible adult on site to evaluate your performance. (Note: Your parent cannot supervise your CAS project.)
