# Hill- Freedman World Academy GOALS

- 1. HFWA School will increase Grades 6-8 students proficient on ELA PSSA from 35.7% in August 2019 to 65.0% by <u>ELA Data</u>
- 2. HFWA School will increase Grades 6-8 students proficient on Math PSSA from 21.5% in August 2019 to 52.0% by Math Data
- 3. HFWA School will increase students who are proficient on all three Keystones (Algebra, Literature, and Biology)
- 4. HFWA School will reach 80% of students attending 95%+ days by SIS attendance data.
- 5. HFWA School will identify and address individual learning needs to support the increases and maintenance of God
